CRIGINAL BURG STATES HULLET KIDES, 21 New Ross No. W.S. 159 Nov 11/48 Dear sis Hoving rean in the wish these that your are collecting Information about the Laish Volunteers I am sending you my bit of information of how they were started in Rom Co Wasqued in Oct 1913 a Friend of mine Dan murphy of Cross Lane new Ross was a footballer Fourmer he was a friend of Lear Etchingham Dan met him at some spoots in Emiscorthy some time before Oct 1913 Don toldme that Etching ham asked him would te get up a company of Volunteers in Ross I went out to William Lemmon of Linshogue and also to Thomas Lacey Irisktown & William Dalton mardling the 5 of us met a agreed to form a company of drish Volunteers We got about 40 boys from Three bullet gate I wish town 4 maudlins to from the company We started to drill about the First of how 1913 Our drill Instruction was William Dalton Dan made it a rule that we have no british as soldiers to doilles or no ese soldiers in the Company We used to drill on Sundays and Wednesday nights

and every time we met me had a policeman after us haned Constable Bryan Donelan a detectine. Sin 1913 Father Guigley got up a Brass band all boys, with Lein Fein wrote on Their caps. He asked us to carry out the Commoration to the manchester martyers or how 24 and his band led us another Volunteer Company was started down town after the Commeration by Phil Lemmon Finshoyal there shop assistant in Row. All asked me to try to get the 2 companys to come together. We agreed and 5 of our company and 5 of Philis met in Pan mufts house . Philis men were William muffy . Joe In Carthy . Patrick Hayden & hartain Deeghan & Phil Lennon. Davis men were William Lamon Thomas Lacey William Dalton Dan murphy Imyself The combined companys carried out drill & rifle pratice on sundays & week nights. The war having broken out all section & creeds goined us in Ros we had about 2 00 Phill Lemnon was Comdt & Joe Inc Corthy vice Comtt. a parade was called one Runday in the summer 1914 Phil Lemon told the ossembled Volunteers that he was resigning as John Kedmond mr and his Volunteers was recruiting for England

and that any man in the parade who wished to goin Phils to step out, the most of the old crowd came over to the Irish Volunteers. Our new Compay now numbered about 40 With Phil Lemnon Cound & goe me Carthy Vice Condt we kept to drilling & rifle pratie We took part in a parade at Castle Hill Emiscorthy Whit Sunday 1915 with all the other Irish Volunteers in County Weseford P. H. Pearse and other leaders reviewed us. I remarked some man saying that day that we were a small crowd only about 300 in the county. Westford . During the summer we carried out dill's sifle protice. We carried out the manchester martyers commeration in 1915 we had the police after us all the time . I athers guigley hand of took part in the secuting meetings at this time . The first time I Leard about the resing was from thil Lannon Coradt about the 1st april 1916 when he asked me for an american revolver. the told me we might be fitting fighting before the month was out. The company paraded on Good Friday night and I hil told us all to be reddy at any time

To fight. We had all kinds of rifles, shotgums. revolver. I had some pike heads made only to put in the Landles when fighting started. I met Phildenmon on Easter Sunday evening and he told me the vising was off. that a man named O Connell told him, this mana was from H. y Dullin. at about 4 oclashon. Easter shorday evening got word from thil Lemmon To go out to Ballynaboola about 5 miles from Kors and find out how many police were in the borrocks about a mile from Ross met all the Ballymalvola police coming into hors in a cor to reinforce the police in hors I believe we going to attach it that night if they had to be in it. We could do nothing in Ross as there was a lot of armed police and Ledmond's Volunteers also employees of certain firm done guard duty in town The people in Ross were very hostile to us. If we made any attempt to fight we would be outnumbered as there was only about 30 in the company in Carter Week. There was no volunteer company any place near Kors in 1916 only a small company in Katharoque about & miles from

The week after the Kising a colum of soldiers tame to Ross and assested all the company and others who were not volunteer, but members of the fealie League. One man was arrested named John Fanning Some time before the vising a resiting agent named Younder of Emiscorthy wanted to address the council on secuting. most anning objected as he said the Country has come to a nice pass when a dedendant of a 98 Loeman wanted them to recruite I rishmen for England to fight for England.
